



How to Play BINGO:

- 1. Read the BINGO card and get excited for all the things your child will learn to do this year!**
- 2. Mark off any things your child is already doing using a small sticker, tick mark, highlighter, etc.**
- 3. Identify themes/characters/activities that already motivates your child to move his/her body. (i.e. transportation, dinosaurs, super heroes, etc.)**
- 4. As you play with your child, you will naturally notice the new things he/she is doing. Enjoy checking these boxes off on the BINGO card!**
- 5. Enjoy getting BINGO across, down, diagonal, 4-corners or full card BINGO as the year progresses.**

Remember, this is meant to be FUN for the whole family! Enjoy watching your children grow and reach different goals. Do NOT go out of your way to be the instructor.

What will your two year old learn this year?

Gross Motor	Fine and Visual Motor	Social/ Regulation	Language/ Communication
Jump up with feet together	Demonstrate preferred hand	Sit at table with little fidgeting	Around 50 word vocabulary
Catch a large ball using arms and chest	Snip with safety scissors	Take turns with adults	Uses two word phrases
Kick a stationary ball	Hold crayon with entire hand to color	Follow 2 step directions	Adults understand half of what they say
Toss small ball forward	Pinch with thumb and pointer finger	Pay attention for 3 minutes	Understands simple "Wh" questions (Who, where...)
