



How to Play BINGO:



- 1. Read the BINGO card and get excited for all the things your child will learn to do this year!**
- 2. Mark off any things your child is already doing using a small sticker, tick mark, highlighter, etc.**
- 3. Identify themes/characters/activities that already motivates your child to move his/her body. (i.e. transportation, dinosaurs, super heroes, etc.)**
- 4. As you play with your child, you will naturally notice the new things he/she is doing. Enjoy checking these boxes off on the BINGO card!**
- 5. Enjoy getting BINGO across, down, diagonal, 4-corners or full card BINGO as the year progresses.**

Remember, this is meant to be FUN for the whole family! Enjoy watching your children grow and reach different goals. Do NOT go out of your way to be the instructor.

What will your three year old learn this year?

Gross Motor	Fine and Visual Motor	Social/ Regulation	Language/ Communication
Jump up and down several times	Trace a thick line	Sit at table with no fidgeting	Around 1000 word vocabulary
Catch a bounced ball with two hands	Open a turn top jar	Frequently use eye contact	Engage in make-believe play
Kick a rolling ball	Stabilize paper with other hand	Follow 3 step directions	Adults understand 75% of what they say
Throw any sized ball forward	String 3 beads	Pay attention for at least 6 minutes	Answer simple "Wh" questions (Who, where...)
